"Let the Wise Hear"

Proverbs 1:5 states, "Let the wise hear and increase in learning, and the one who understands obtain guidance." The key word for me in this verse is "and". Without this single word nothing happens for the one who hears but does not listen. Knowledge may be gained but without understanding guidance falters and will ultimately never come to the listener. All church leadership should "listen" to what this Proverb states as how to "obtain guidance". This summer as a church we will try to listen in another way to obtain a clearer vision for our current and future ministries.

Starting in June, I will be leading (in conjunction with other church leadership) several small group discussions with different groups within the congregation. The goal of our time together is to create a list of ministry expectations and short-term goals for different life groups within First Christian Church.

We will specifically target the different life groups by age and where they are in their life journey. Here is the initial list and dates of the first round of discussions. The initial listening sessions will be held immediately after worship in the sanctuary on the listed Sundays in June. Alternate listening sessions will be added in July when possible.

June 9th No discussion groups due to the Street Party and VBS


June 16th Young adults 18-30

MISSION COALITION MISSION STATEMENT AND HISTORY

"Mission Coalition is an ecumenical lay ministry open to representatives from all Newton church congregations to provide a network of information and support to outreach projects of mutual interest to help those in need in Jasper County."

Mission Coalition was organized in May, 1995 under the guidance of Shirley Dont member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church. This group helped initiate the Big Brothers/Big Sisters program in Newton. Since that time, the group expanded the service projects in the community with fundraisers.

When there was a Newton Ministerial Association, the group had a representative sit in on the discussions and funds were provided for the Compassion Fund. Projects for the prison system in the county included giving books to prisoners at Riverview Release Center so inmates could read a book to their child. The group was also involved in the Mitchellville Women's prison chapel funding. For many years the member churches delivered weekend Meals on Wheels to individuals on the Elderly Nutrition list. Due to Medicaid changes and COVID, the group is no longer involved with this program.

Funding was also given to El Salvador mission trips taken by Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Domestic Violence Center, Aces Teen Center in Newton, Quakerdale Youth Shelter at the old Jasper County Home. Mission Coalition also supported projects at Skiff Hospital, now Mercy One Newton, including the First Dose program and Skiff Hospice. Other organizations helped included RRACAP (Red Rock Community Action Program) now known as IMPACT for utility bills, Your First Step, Those Loving Children, Haven of Hope, Hephzibah House, and Beds for Kids sponsored by First Christian Church.

Members Shirley Dont, Sacred Heart Catholic and Linda Curtis-Stolper, First Presbyterian, were instrumental in writing the two booklets used in the Good Friday Way of the Cross Walk. This Walk continues each year to the seven downtown churches for a time of scripture, prayer, song, and reflection.
